

# Diving

## North Wall

A great dive for beginners, this dive starts at 10 feet. Follow the wall and see beautiful rock formations filled with puffer fish, angelfish and more. *Depth: 10-60 feet.* 

## Pelican Rock

The most popular local dive site. Swim with schools of goatfish, grouper, snappers and jacks. Follow the sandy ledge to the wall that drops down to over 1,000 feet into the submarine canyon. Beautiful sea fans, angelfish, Moorish idols and an occasional sea turtle or manta ray can be seen here. A great experience for beginners and experts alike. *Depth: 20-130 feet.* 

## **Sandfalls**

Jacques Cousteau discovered this world-famous dive site. Large amounts of sand build up at shallow depths and spill down the valley toward the sand falls. At 90 feet, the sand meets the wall and drops straight down for hundreds of feet resembling a waterfall. Because of the depth, this dive is not recommended for beginners. *Depth: 90 feet*.

# Middle Wall

A wall dive for experienced divers only. This is an excellent dive for those who want to go deep. See large schools of rays, and beautiful sea fans, gorgonians, moray eels, lobster and more. *Depth:* 80-130 feet.

## Neptune's Finger

This is an excellent departure to descend into the submarine canyon. This rocky pinnacle is thickly carpeted with invertebrate life including orange tubas, Rae corals, sea fans and indigo-coloured gorgonians. Tropical reef fish abound including Moorish idols, parrotfish, sergeant majors and butterfly fish. Schools of eagle, bat and manta rays are also spotted at this site. *Depth: 30-130 feet*.

#### Whale's Head

Enjoy beautiful diving right outside the bay. See many lobsters, sea urchins, eels, starfish, stingrays, angelfish, puffers and more. A good dive for beginners as well as experts. *Depth:* 30-60 feet.

## Land's End

Dive with seal lions in their own habitat at the end of the Baja Peninsula. Large schools of sardines, mackerel and skipjacks can all be seen here. Different types of coral formations attract smaller tropical fish as well. This dive includes the remains of a small shipwreck - and divers may even have the chance to pet a giant green moray eel. *Depth: 30-80 feet*.

## Santa Maria

A great dive for everyone! Explore underwater channels to see coral, sea fans, hawk fish, wrasses, triggerfish, sea turtles, butterfly fish and many more. Great for underwater photography. Very popular for snorkelling. *Depth: 30-60 feet.* 

# Blowhole

This rock structure is a great dive, where water surge is forced through a hole in the rock. The backside of the huge formation forms a wall covered with crevices, ravines and tunnels. See gorgonians, sea fans and coral throughout. Swim with guitarfish, surgeonfish and hogfish. Sometimes, sea turtles, manta rays, jacks, nurse sharks and groupers are also discovered. Great for all levels of experience. *Depth: 40-100 feet*.

## Las Salinas Shipwreck

Dive an old Portuguese freighter. This wreck attracts plenty of sea life including red snapper, goatfish, Moorish idols, surgeonfish, trumpet fish, triggers and lots more. A great dive for all experience levels.
